Getting Educated: Neighbor by Neighbor and GEDs

Neighbor by Neighbor is thrilled to announce that, in partnership with Michigan Works! And New Buffalo Schools, we are opening a new GED site, which will be housed in the New Buffalo Library. The program is in its early stages, but four participants are already enrolled and taking steps towards a better tomorrow.

The GED program has already been implemented in Galien and is working well, with fourteen students currently enrolled. By expanding to New Buffalo, it makes the program more accessible to residents of our area, and keeps them from having to find the transportation to Benton Harbor. Kip Walker and Liz James are volunteers with Neighbor by Neighbor and are spearheading the program, and are doing a phenomenal job.

Kip says from day one, each potential client can expect the following from the program:

- · A GED plan to fit each individual with one-on-one support from teachers and volunteers.
- · Each plan is designed so clients can work at their own pace.
- · Free laptops, while in the program, which allows clients to study GED materials at home.
- · GED support software and workbooks aimed specifically at getting clients ready for each test.


